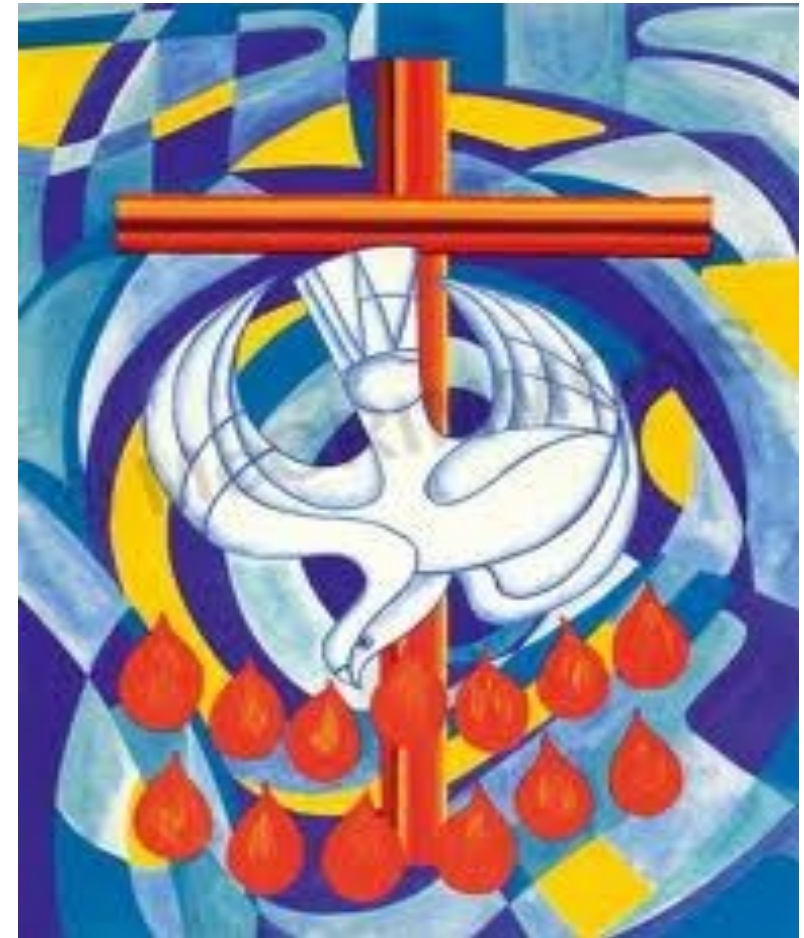

## **SAINTS ALIVE!**

**May 8th: Annora of Iffley**, anchoress, 13th C.

Born in 1179, she was an anchoress at St Mary's church, Iffley. The daughter of a powerful baron who fell out with King John, Annora was imprisoned in Bristol Castle; her mother and brother were put in Windsor Castle where they starved to death. After being widowed, Annora followed the example of her sister, Loretta, and became an anchoress (an enclosed solitary). There are records indicating that King Henry III gave her an annual supply of firewood and other gifts. She lived the contemplative life in the English medieval tradition of an anchoress and today the church is witnessing a resurgence of those called to be solitaries. Annora is remembered over 900 years later. (*Those interested in finding out more about the Anchoritic tradition could consult 'Ancrene Wisse' in Deddington Church Library*)

**May 15th: Charles Williams**, teacher, spiritual writer 1886-1945

A contemporary and friend of C S Lewis and Tolkien, Charles Williams became a prolific writer of plays, novels, poetry, theology, biography and criticism. He worked for most of his life in the Oxford University Press and lectured in the city and university. He was perhaps the most original lay theologian of the century (his chief books in this field being *The Descent of the Dove*, "a history of the Holy Spirit in the Church" (1939), and *He Came Down From Heaven* (1938)). Above all, he was passionately interested in the ways in which romantic love can be a key to understanding our relationship with God. This vision blended with his critical work in his great study of Dante, *The Figure of Beatrice* (1943), which inspired Dorothy L. Sayers to translate the "Divine Comedy" into English.

## **From the Vicar**

The Parish APCMs were contrasting affairs. The gloomy financial situation made the evening rather grim in Barford. The good news (average attendance in 2011 up by 50% on the preceding year; strong fund-raising at the Fete and other generous contributions to the life of the Church in various forms by various people) was largely obscured by the realisation that, if we continue to run with a deficit at the level of 2011 (2010 was even worse) we shan't be running much longer. Yes, you've heard that before and it was true when you first heard it, but the time-frame for going out of business has narrowed to two or three years.

What can be done? We shall probably be able to reduce our spending on St John's considerably. A group wanting to develop St John's as a place of quiet and prayer is prepared to take on the costs of insurance, electricity use and maintenance. If this is agreed with the Diocese (the PCC has already agreed in principle) we shall save about £1,000 per annum. This development would not impact adversely on normal services at St John's or on baptisms, weddings, funerals or burials there.

Dan will leave us fairly shortly, probably in the summer of 2013. This will allow a saving in the short term of nearly £2K on expenses incurred for his accommodation, etc. However, those expenses will have to be borne by us again in the next few years should another Curate come our way.

Some significant monies will accrue to Barford as a result of my absence in Sweden at the end of the year which will ease the immediate situation, but a permanent solution to our financial difficulties involves raised giving from church members and the wider community. The costs of paying clergy and running and maintaining Parish churches are not subsidised by the Church of England through diocesan or national funds; we in the parishes have to do it ourselves. Though the non-churchgoing community should of course be contributing to the Barford churches, the lead surely has to be taken by church people. There will be an Open Meeting in the Village Hall on Tuesday May 29<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm to consider the future of our churches.

The Deddington APCM was a cheerier affair. The Parish does not face imminent bankruptcy. That it doesn't is down to a responsible and realistic attitude on the part of the congregation to the costs of funding a Church of England parish to do the best it can in Christ's mission, the Church's mission, the beginnings of which we celebrate at the end of this month at Pentecost. The Treasurer's challenge to all present and other church members to raise their regular weekly or monthly giving by £1.85 a week per person in order to move towards the goal of being able to support a Youth Worker on a permanent basis was received respectfully and, it seemed, accepted cheerfully on the spot by a number of parishioners. God loves a cheerful giver and shows it in the blessings he bestows on such people.

And here's another (irregular) funding-related challenge. Watch the Vicar vanish and help Church funds! I shall be disappearing, as you know, for four months at the end of the year and it seems a good idea to get you used in easy stages to this idea. During the month of May bits of me will be gradually vanishing under a new regime of



exercise and dieting. Sponsor this weight loss to raise funds for either Barford or Deddington parish and to help yourself gently to come to terms with my forthcoming total invisibility. The weigh-in has already happened (a private matter between the Vicar, his body and the scales – you’ll just have to trust me!) and the weigh-out will be on the morning of Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup>. Sign up on the sponsorship sheets. Amount? Difficult to know how a glutton and a wine-bibber might fare over a month. I’m sponsoring myself at a fiver per pound lost. *Hugh*



**Street Pastors** is a nationwide interdenominational church response to urban problems. Members of several churches in Banbury have worked together to form Banbury Street Pastors. The Pastors were commissioned on 23 March 2012 and teams of 4 or 5 now go out on alternate Friday and Saturday nights between 10pm and 4am to engage with, primarily, young people, on the streets, outside bars and clubs. The Pastors are well-received by police, doormen and others.

Whilst the Pastors patrol, there is a group of Prayer Pastors who remain at base (Marlborough Road Methodist Church) to pray and make cups of tea for the Pastors when they come in for a break.

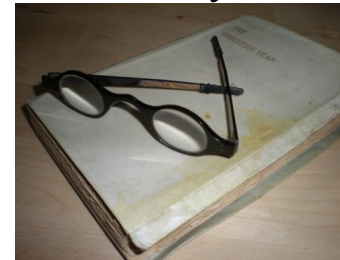

## A History of **CHRISTIANITY** *in fifteen objects*



**OBJECT 11: John Keble's Spectacles, presented by the Bishop of Gibraltar, Dr Geoffrey Rowell**

**Thursday, 10 May, at 7.30pm in Church  
Admission Free**

On 14 July 1833, a young Oxford don rose to the pulpit of the University Church of St. Mary the Virgin in Oxford and preached a sermon that would come to mark the beginning of one of the most significant religious movements in English, and Anglican, church history - the so-called 'Oxford Movement'. This celebrated campaign by a group of Oxford dons has come to be associated with increased ritual in public worship and neo-Gothic architecture, but for John Keble, John Henry Newman, Edward Pusey and others at Oxford in the early nineteenth century, their efforts did not originate in concern for a religious aesthetic, but from a deeply held concern for the sustenance of the Christian's credal commitment to the 'catholic and apostolic Church' in an age of reform and revolution across Europe.

Dr Geoffrey Rowell has been the third Bishop of Gibraltar in Europe since 2001. For many years he was Chaplain and Fellow in Theology at Keble College, Oxford, and, from 1994 until 2001, was the Bishop of Basingstoke in the Diocese of Winchester. He was written widely on the Oxford Movement, and with Rowan Williams and Kenneth Stevenson was an editor of *Love's Redeeming Work* (Oxford University Press), an important compendium of Anglican spiritual writings from across the centuries.
